






To the People and City / Love,

Issues We All Care About...

Affordable Housing

As the elected Chair of the City's Housing Crisis Task Force, I am painfully aware that housing problems demand both immediate and long-term action. I drafted and passed a \$26 million historic affordable housing bond to create safe homes for all, and you have my word that I will never stop my efforts to end housing insecurity.

Crime and Policing

The fight to keep our communities safe must never stop. Providence is critically short of officers—and that must change. I advocate wholeheartedly for increased funding for community policing, with a focus on more relevant training, diversion programs and non-violent education. Officers must reflect the neighborhoods they patrol.

Education

In two short years, the state's lackluster takeover of Providence public schools will end, and the responsibility to educate our young people will be ours again. We cannot wait until the last minute to do our homework! Quality education translates into a more robust economy, and even safer streets. This issue requires careful thought, sufficient funding and heartfelt commitment. I pledge all three.

ATVs

Our neighborhoods need to feel safe! Legislation that I drafted is now in place to keep these dangerous, noisy threats to public safety off our streets. The clear, legal framework I created is being used as a model by other municipalities. Since my legislation became law, over 250 illegal machines have been destroyed.

I'm an Environmental Advocate in Action!

Caring about the environment is not a choice anymore—and neither is just talking about it. These issues demand action—real, tangible changes—that will make an impact sooner than later.

- ✓ After two years of hard work, the landmark Plastic Bag Reduction Act that I drafted was voted into law in 2019—and to this day, it's one of my most rewarding accomplishments.
- ✓ I partnered with many neighbors and multiple agencies, from the Department of Environmental Management to the Department of Transportation to bring the Stormwater Management Project to life. Using tree filtration systems to clean stormwater, we are taking bold, progressive action.



Economic Leadership Matters

As Chairperson of the Finance Committee, I dedicate myself to strict fiscal practices. I will remain a good steward of the city's finances.

- ✓ We have a balanced city budget and a rainy day fund, with no property tax increase in 8 years!
- ✓ When Providence received Covid relief funds, I acted immediately to put \$43 million to work, for homeless intervention, sewer repair, citywide wi-fi to support education and small business relief.
- ✓ I worked to allocate \$7 million of Covid relief money to business owners, immediately.
- ✓ The remainder of Covid relief money must be spent with the utmost care. This infusion of funding may only occur once in our lifetimes, and has the power to make a meaningful difference for years, even decades to come.
- ✓ I support strategic Tax Stabilization Agreements. They say "Yes!" to local development, employment opportunities and economic security for our communities.

- ✓ I earned both a Bachelor's degree and a Master's degree in Business Administration, with a concentration in Finance, from Providence College.
